Sketch a WW2 plane, remembering to add camouflaged detail and logos.	Write a diary entry as a child evacuee sent to the countryside to escape London.	Respond to your piece of favourite music through art – how does it make you feel? What pictures, images or colours come to mind?	Create a list of instructions you can give to next year's Year 6 about how to get ready for the SATs.
Create a spelling game helping others to practice their spellings.	Write a letter to an elderly relative or a care home wishing them a safe time.	Design your own Anderson Shelter. If you have the materials around, can you make one?	Create a maths game focusing on either times tables or fractions.
Create an e-safety poster explaining to someone how to stay safe online.	Write a book review of your favourite book or author.	Create a project (either a booklet or a PowerPoint) explaining everything you have learnt about WW2.	Make shadow puppets to be used with a torch and a dark room. Can your shadows link to WW2?
Practice painting and drawing – sometimes it can be relaxing and help your mind switch off from other things going on in your life.	Get out in the garden and watering the plants or take care of the flowers.	Write a recount of an aerial dog-fight between the RAF and the Luftwaffe over the skies of southern England during WW2.	Go to your local park or in your garden and choose a sporting activity to keep yourself fit and healthy.
